## Who We Serve

BPC advocates sustainable industry practices, resilient and climate-ready infrastructure, and healthy recreational opportunities for our communities to create a more vibrant and thriving Bay Area.

### Sustainable Commerce & Industry

At its core, BPC meets an essential need for maintaining economic vitality in the Bay Area by advocating for regional, state and federal policies to secure necessary funding for the US Army Corps of Engineers, which carry out essential dredging of harbors and waterways in the Bay and Delta. Representing dredging operators, ports, development firms, BPC speaks with a unified voice in meeting the regulatory and environmental needs for a thriving Bay Area while meeting the needs of the maritime industry as a whole.



### Resilient Infrastructure

To promote sustainable commerce and industry practices, BPC has collaborated with governmental agencies, environmental organizations, private industry and many others to reduce inefficiencies and increase inter-agency cooperation. BPC has worked hand-in-hand with BCDC to protect shoreline interests while addressing the important issues of climate change and sea level rise in order to promote resilient infrastructure. Advocating for the expansion of reusable dredged sediment to safeguard critical shoreline assets against flood and sea-level rise are among BPC's key prerogatives.



### Recreation and the Natural Environment

BPC's use of an informed scientific approach to direct its actions has earned the trust and recognition of all who see the group as a coalition that establishes the vitality and balance of the Bay Area environment. BPC's activities have recently expanded to include planning, communication and consensus-building related to navigation and dredging, water and air quality, energy and water supply, and wetlands and wildlife issues. Most notably, BPC is a founding member of the San Francisco Bay Wetland Joint Venture, which is dedicated to the restoration of wetlands and habitats in the Bay Area.
