As Maritime Director for the Port of San Francisco, Peter Dailey is responsible for managing and marketing one of the most varied maritime business portfolios of any Port in the United States including cargo and cruise shipping, ship repair, ferry/excursion boats, harbor services and commercial fishing.

He has worked in various capacities at the Port of San Francisco since 1987. Most recently led the Port of San Francisco's program to install shore-side power for cruise vessels as a part of an extensive environmental program in conjunction with the cruise industry and environmental groups. San Francisco was the first Port in California to install shore power for cruise ships. He is also focused on the current construction of the Pier 27 International Cruise Terminal and planning for the upcoming America's Cup that will be held at the Port in 2013.

He is serving as Chairman of the American Association of Port Authorities Cruise Committee; a member of the Board of Directors of the Marine Exchange of the San Francisco Bay Region; the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission's Seaport Planning Advisory Committee; California Association of Port Authorities Advisory Committee and a Director of the St. Mary's College of California Scholarship Committee.
