Most committees meet quarterly, with additional meetings based on policy and advocacy needs.



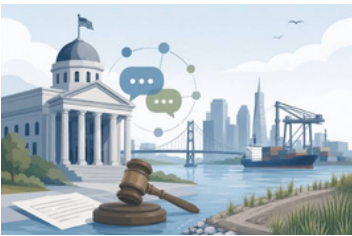
Dredging & Beneficial Reuse Committee

The Dredging & Beneficial Reuse Committee promotes reliable dredging of the Bay Area's waterways and advances the beneficial reuse of sediment. Its work brings together permitting, policy, and regional science to support efficient dredging operations and project delivery.



Efficient Permitting Committee

The Efficient Permitting Committee focuses on practical reforms that make environmental review and permitting more effective while maintaining necessary environmental protections. Its work promotes interagency coordination, a predictable regulatory environment, and the timely delivery of infrastructure and resilience projects.



Government Affairs Committee

The Government Affairs Committee guides BPC's engagement on regional policy developments. Its work helps members understand emerging issues, shape BPC's advocacy positions, and engage with elected officials and agencies.



Resilient Shorelines Committee

The Resilient Shorelines Committee supports policies and partnerships that strengthen the Bay Area's shorelines, infrastructure, and communities. Its work centers on local and regional planning to advance climate adaptation and resilient transportation along the waterfront.
