NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING AND NOTICE OF INTENT

TO CONSIDER APPROVAL OF A NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND ADOPTION OF A GENERAL ORDER FOR RECYCLED WATER USE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) will hold a public meeting to receive public comments on proposed General Waste Discharge Requirements for Recycled Water Use (General Order) and an associated California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Initial Study/Negative Declaration (Negative Declaration). The State Water Board may adopt the General Order and approve the Negative Declaration at the end of the meeting. The location and time of the public meeting is provided below.

BACKGROUND

The State Water Board is preparing a General Order that will be used by the Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Water Boards) to streamline permitting of recycled water uses that typically are a relatively low threat to water quality. Recycled water is water which, as a result of treatment of waste, is suitable for reuse that would not otherwise occur.

The source of recycled water is primarily treated domestic wastewater. The General Order does not authorize direct or indirect potable uses of recycled water, but will authorize use of recycled water for beneficial uses such as irrigation of crops, dust control, and certain industrial processes. The General Order will allow the use of recycled water that would meet the water recycling regulations and reuse criteria specified in the California Code of Regulations, title 22, division 4, chapter 3 (title 22), with the exception of groundwater recharge activities. Title 22, prescribes water recycling and reuse criteria protective of public health. When recycled water is used in compliance with the title 22, recycled water is safe for approved uses.
