Phillips 66 - 8th Annual Walk of Honor for Our Veterans



The “Walk of Honor for Our Veterans” event is fortunate to have Stephen Shodeen, SFC, US Army/Army Reserves (ret.) as our guest speaker.

SFC Shodeen joined the Army Reserves while still in high school, and attended Basic Training between his junior and senior year. He continued to serve for the following 2 yrs. as a Communications and Electronics Specialist (31V) with the 483rd Transportation BN at Oakland Army Base.

In 1987 he joined active duty as an Infantryman (11B), and was later selected to join The 3rd US Infantry Regiment (The Old Guard) at Ft. Myer, Virginia. While a member of The Old Guard, he was on a Full Honor Casket Team, which conducted Army funerals in Arlington National Cemetery and surrounding cemeteries. He later tried-out and became a member of The United States Army Drill Team, representing the Army and performing nationwide. He later trained and became a Sentinel and Assistant Relief Commander at The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. He is listed as the 386th Tomb Guard Identification Badge Holder, since the badge was awarded in 1958. There are just over 600 Tomb Guard badges issued to this day.

SFC Shodeen volunteered to be an Army recruiter and returned to the Bay Area for 3 years, recruiting in Oakland, Richmond, Alameda and the tri-valley area. After leaving active duty, SFC Shodeen was member of different reserves units at Camp Parks in Dublin, supporting the missions at hand. He is currently in the Retired Reserves. He is currently a police officer with Livermore Police Department, and also served with the San Leandro Police Department prior, for a total of 17 yrs.

SFC Shodeen is married to a California school teacher, and has 2 adult daughters, the oldest who is currently an Army Sgt. serving as a Combat Photographer (Airborne) and is an Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran.
