New law adds California Conservation Corps to help invasive aquatic plants control programs

Senate Bill 704, by Senator Cathleen Galgiani (D-Stockton), was signed into law September 11. It requires the Division of Boating and Waterways, to the extent feasible, collaborate with the California Conservation Corps and use members of the corps in implementing its aquatic invasive species programs. The Division of Boating and Waterways is the lead agency that identifies, detects, controls, and administers programs to manage invasive aquatic plants in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, its tributaries, and the Suisun Marsh.
