Dr. Josh Burnam, Anchor QEA

Dr. Joshua Burnam, MPH, D.Env., is a principal environmental planner at Anchor QEA, LLC. His area of practice is primarily the planning, design, construction and oversight of projects relating to waterfront redevelopment, industrial development, navigation, coastal infrastructure, dredging, and sediment management. Prior to joining Anchor QEA, Dr. Burnam was a senior regulatory project manager and regional expert for dredging, port development, and energy infrastructure for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Regulatory Program. He served as the Los Angeles District regulatory dredging coordinator, chairman of the Dredging

Operations Subcommittee of the Los Angeles Contaminated Sediments Task Force, and the lead regulator for numerous dredging and Port projects.



John Coleman, Bay Planning Coalition

John Coleman is the Chief Executive Officer of the Bay Planning Coalition, a non-profit, public benefit, membership corporation, to advocate for the balanced regulation and use of Bay-Delta resources to ensure that commerce, recreation and the environment thrive in the region. The Coalition's 175 members represent a broad spectrum of public and private Bay-Delta entities, including ports, maritime and shoreline industry, labor unions, local government, residential and commercial builders, recreational users and engineering, planning, environmental science, construction and legal professionals.

Coleman was elected in 1990 and since re-elected to the Board of Directors of the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD). Coleman was elected to serve as the President of the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) in December 2013. Coleman currently serves in the following capacities: Board Member of the Marine Exchange of the San Francisco Bay Region; member of the Freeport Regional Water Authority (FRWA); Chair of the Upper Mokelumne River Watershed Authority (UMRWA); Board Member of the East Bay Leadership Council; member of the San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority Advisory Committee; member of the East Bay Economic Development Alliance Legislative Committee, and Board Member of DERWA, the joint powers authority for recycled water service provided by EBMUD and the Dublin-San Ramon Services District.



Dr. Gary Griggs, University of California at Santa Cruz

Dr. Gary Griggs received his B.A. in Geological Sciences from the University of California Santa Barbara (1965) and a Ph.D. in Oceanography from Oregon State University (1968). He has been a Professor of Earth & Planetary Sciences at the University of California Santa Cruz for 50 years and was Director of the Institute of Marine Sciences for 26 years, where he led the development of a Coastal Science Campus. His research, teaching and writing have been focused on the coast of California and include coastal erosion and protection, coastal engineering and sealevel rise. He just completed his 9th and 10th books.

In 1998 he was given the Outstanding Faculty Award at U.C. Santa Cruz and the Alumni Association honored him with a Distinguished Teaching Award in 2006. The California Coastal Commission and Sunset Magazine named him one of California's Coastal Heroes in 2009, and in 2010 he was elected to

the California Academy of Sciences. He has served on three National Academy of Sciences Committees, and in 2016 was appointed to the California Ocean Science Trust. In 2017 he chaired the California Ocean Protection Council-Science Advisory Team Working Group on Sea-Level Rise Guidance for California and is presently serving as chair of California's 4th Climate Assessment Committee on Coasts and Ocean.

Diane Isley, Clean Marina Program

Diane Isley is the Harbor Master for 32 years at Emery Cove Yacht Harbor located on the San Francisco Bay in Emeryville. Emery Cove is a private 'dockominium' marina with 450 slips. Diane has been involved with the Clean Marine Program since 2006 as a Lead Reviewer and currently on the Board of Directors since 2012.

She has been around the water her entire life; born at a boatyard on Lake Michigan owned by her family. She is also a member of the Bay Planning Coalition and Past President of the California Association of Harbor Masters & Port Captains.



Paul Kaplan, KKMI

Paul Kaplan is a founding partner of KKMI, a company that operates service/repair facilities in Pt. Richmond and Sausalito. A San Francisco native, Paul's early ambitions as a marine biologist were altered when he took a part-time job and became the youngest licensed yacht broker in California. After working as a broker for many years Paul took a hiatus to find the marine industry calling again. In 1996 Paul cofounded KKMI. KKMI has been recognized by the California Water Environment Association as their "Small Industry of the Year" and the American Boat Builder's and Repairers Association "Boatyard of the Year". Paul's passion for all things nautical and dedication to the marine industry allows him to serve as a Director of the

Marine Recreation Association.
