Floating and aquatic vegetation control program (correction)

The Division of Boating and Waterways has begun the 2018 floating and submersed aquatic vegetation control program using both herbicide treatments and mechanical harvesting. These programs are taking place from March through December.

Delta Conservancy begins Central Delta Corridor Partnership regional planning process

The Delta Conservancy is coordinating a 9-month public process that will bring together land owners, agencies, and interested stakeholders to collaboratively develop an initial coordinated corridor strategy for management and restoration of publicly funded lands along the Central Delta corridor. This planning effort will consist of a public workshop to introduce the partnership and planning process, a 1.5-day charrette workshop, a series of half-day workshops to develop and discuss strategies, and a final public workshop to present the draft planning document and solicit input.
