NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

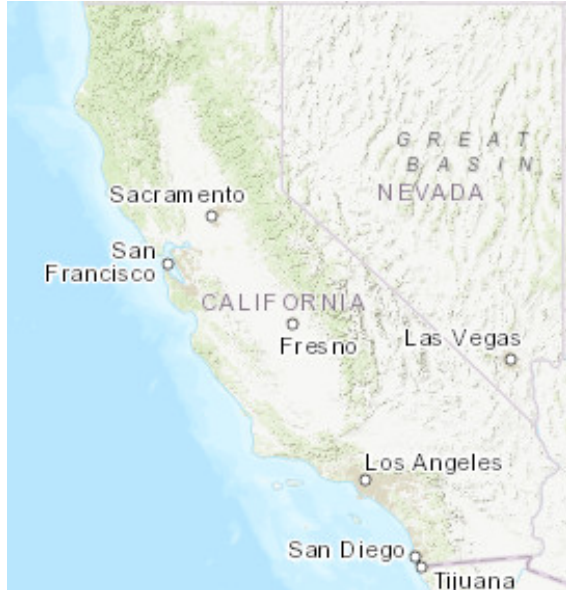
- High Risk Today for Gusty N-NE/Offshore Winds Sacramento Valley and Surrounding Foothills, Southern Mid Coast, and Santa Cruz/Diablo.
- Afternoon SW Gusts to 25-30 mph this Weekend Along and East of the Cascade-Sierra Crest.
- A weak and broad high pressure ridge will be overhead through Saturday. After a low pressure trough moves through Sunday high pressure will return Mon-Wed.
- N-NE/Offshore wind pattern through midday tomorrow in the Sacramento Valley and foothills and mainly on the mid/upper slopes throughout the Bay Area, and north to Lake County.
- Peak gusts will be 25-35 mph this morning, with higher gusts in wind-prone spots. Winds late tonight through early Friday will be significantly lighter, but still N-NE/Offshore.
- Relative humidity (RH) recovery to only 15-35% tonight. Dry air will remain on mid and upper slopes tomorrow night. Minimum afternoon RH 8-18%, lowest in breezy areas.
- Afternoon SW gusts 25-30 mph this Sat-Sun along Cascade-Sierra crest & E with low RH.
- Warm and dry with light to locally moderate offshore winds early next week.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

- A quiet weather pattern will continue through the weekend with only slight day-to-day changes in temperatures, wind speeds and relative humidity levels. It will turn windy in/near the desert next week.
- Local north winds of 10-20 mph along the I-5 Corridor and Santa Barbara County this morning.
- Northwest winds of 15-25 mph each afternoon along the central coast, Salinas Valley and near Pt. Conception each afternoon.
- A few cumulus buildups possible today and Friday in the low desert and Cleveland N.F.
- Temperatures will reach 70s in the mountains to the mid 90s in the valleys through Saturday before readings drop a little early next week.
- Minimum RH outside the desert will mainly be in the teens the next 3 days, but a few areas of the Angeles and southern Los Padres National Forest will see minimums reach the 8-12% range today.
- Gusty westerly winds of 20-30 mph will be possible in and near the desert beginning Sunday.
- Offshore winds are no longer expected next week.

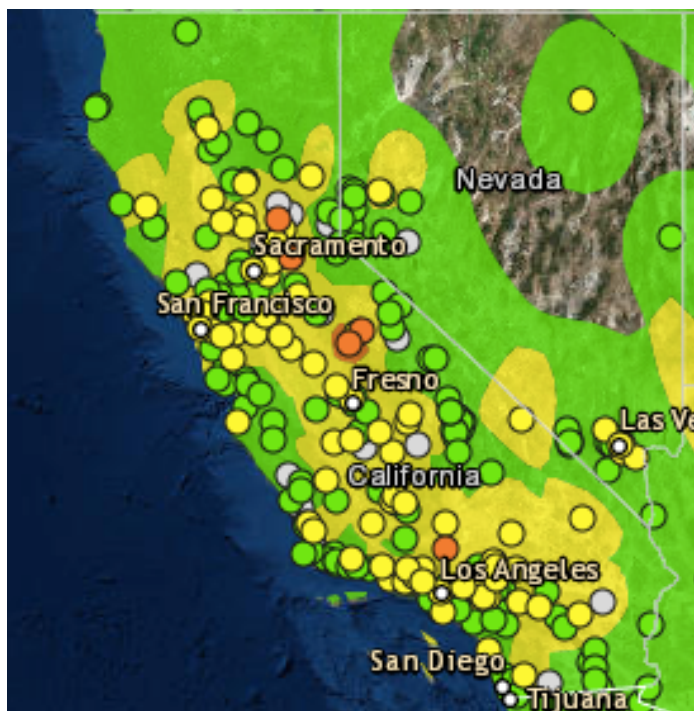
North America Smoke Plumes September 20, 2018

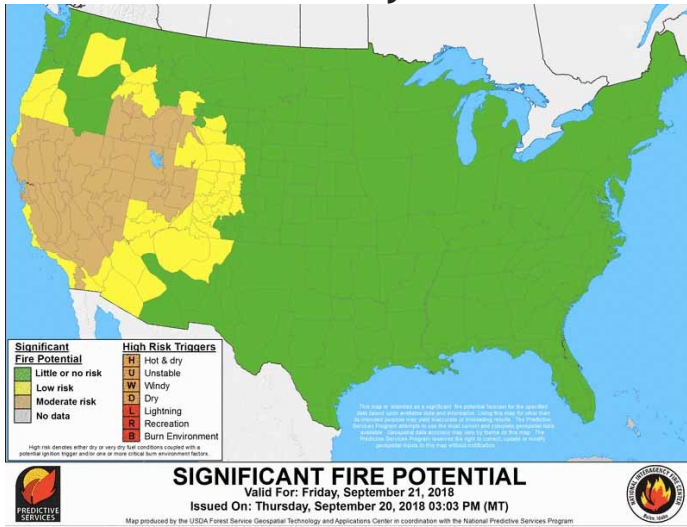

Air Quality Forecast for Friday, September 21

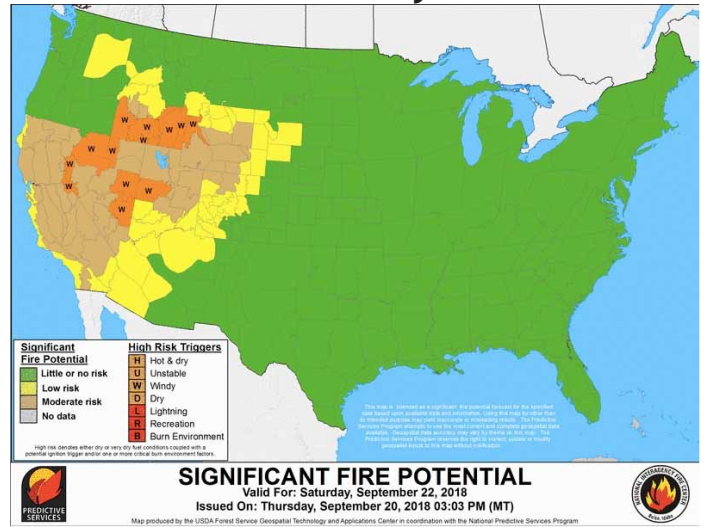

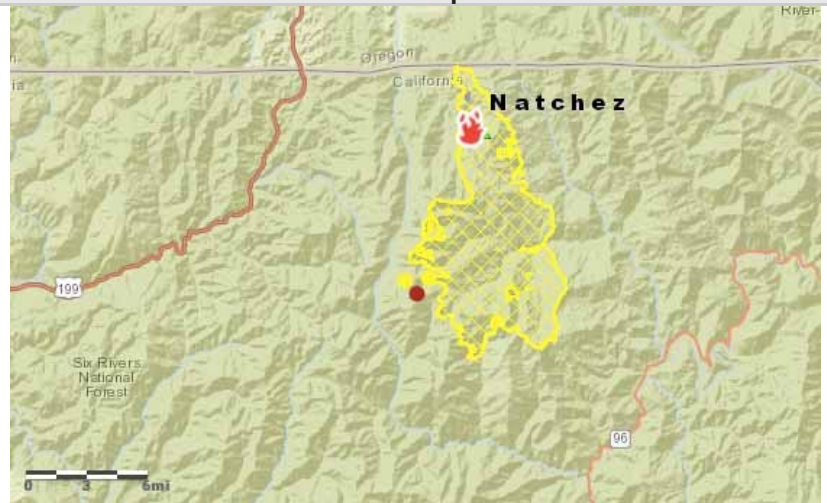

USGS Post-Fire Debris Flow Hazard Assessment Maps

The USGS conducts post-fire debris-flow hazard assessments for select fires in the Western U.S. We use geospatial data related to basin morphometry, burn severity, soil properties, and rainfall characteristics to estimate the probability and volume of debris flows that may occur in response to a design storm. Wildfire can significantly alter the hydrologic response of a watershed to the extent that even modest rainstorms can produce dangerous flash floods and debris flows.
