




Mission




Senate Bill (SB) 1 Grant Program

- In 2021, Governor Newsom signed SB 1 into law.
- In 2022 and 2023, The Ocean Protection Council (OPC) received \$37.5 million and \$54.5 million respectively to support the implementation of SB 1 through the SB 1 Grant Program, with an additional \$10 million anticipated in the 2024-2025 budget.
- The goal of the SB 1 Grant Program is to support the implementation of SB 1 by funding Sea Level Rise adaptation planning and projects along the entire geographic coast of all of California and San Francisco Bay.







SB 1 Grant Program Eligibility

- Applicants that are eligible to apply for this SB 1 Grant Program opportunity consist of:
 - Local governments
 - Regional governments
 - Federally recognized tribal governments
 - Organizations or consultants who apply on a government's behalf may be considered, however, explicit support and collaboration between the organization and government must be provided within the application (via Letter of Support)







SB 1 Grant Program Funding

\$200,000 - \$1,500,000

Maximum Project Timeline

2 years

Proposal Review

 Proposals are accepted through a rolling, quarterly, non-competitive process

NOT YET OPEN

Track 2: SLR Implementation Projects

Funding Range

\$1,500,000 - \$10,000,000

Maximum Project Timeline

3 years

Proposal Review

 Proposals are accepted through a competitive process starting in late 2024





SB 1 Technical Assistance Program

The complementary SB 1 Technical Assistance (TA) Program provides application assistance to local, regional, and tribal governments that represent priority communities applying for SLR adaptation planning funding through the SB 1 Grant Program.

TA Provider helps TA recipient complete their proposal













Coastal Funding Database





Santa Clara County Climate Collaborative Resilience Fund

Coastal Quest in partnership with the Santa Clara County Climate Collaborative is designing and pilot testing Resilience Fund to support implementation of resilience solutions in vulnerable communities across the county. As MOU partner we are managing planning process and administering funds. Seeking partners to build Resilience Fund and public financing revenue streams. Model for state and country to replicate.

Impact Case Study

Ninth Root (West Oakland, CA)

Tamila "Shy" Walker founded Ninth Root and "Sacred Spaces Project" to serve the Lower Bottoms community

This year we gave Ninth Root a \$5000 small grant, and they joined Coastal Quest as an incubated project where we manage their finances and administration, provide assistance with grant-writing and program strategy. Since February 2023 we have helped them secure over \$450k in funding to restore degraded coastal habit in West Oakland.

Impact Case Study

Small Grants Program

Funded by Wells Fargo, Douglas and Lisa Goldman Foundation, Edison International, Marisla Foundation, and California Ocean Protection Council, the Small Grants Program funds efforts that reduce climate risks and support coastal resilience.

This past year we have granted over \$950k in small grants to over 30 community groups in California and expanding into Pacific and Alaska. We are seeding and accelerating coastal solutions that benefit people, nature, and the climate by ensuring access to our coasts and clean water, restoring and protecting unique habitat, and developing projects that sequester carbon and reduce climate impacts
