## Advocacy Efforts

### State Budget Advocacy

This month, in support of regional resilience funding, BPC urged the Assembly and Senate Budget Committee Chairs to expedite the appropriation of Proposition 4 funds to address the Bay Area's severe climate risks.

This includes \$70 million for shoreline flood management (up from \$33 million), \$62 million for coastal resilience (up from \$31 million), and \$40 million for Bay restoration efforts (up from \$20 million). This funding will



support earlier implementation of flood protection and infrastructure upgrade projects in the region alongside nature-based solutions.

## Federal Advocacy Efforts

On the federal front, BPC joined a coalition of partners to support a request for Congress to appropriate \$15 million in the Fiscal Year 2026 budget to support a pilot program aimed at advancing sub-seasonal to seasonal (S2S) precipitation forecasting in the western United States. This critical investment would enhance the accuracy and reliability of medium- to long-range precipitation forecasts, providing water managers, reservoir operators, and emergency planners with better tools to prepare for droughts, floods, and other climate-driven extremes.
